Many different trees surround Potter Lake. Circle the leaf once you find the tree.



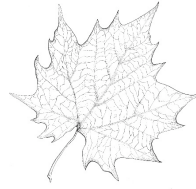

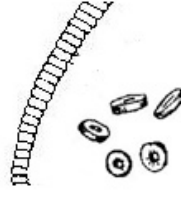

Fossil Invertebrate Animals

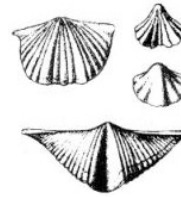
The bridge is made of limestone and is full of fossil invertebrate animals! Put a star by the ones you see.
